115928.5 – Whenever a building permit is issued for the remodel or modification of an existing swimming pool, toddler pool, or spa, the permit shall require that the suction outlet of the existing swimming pool, toddler pool, or spa be upgraded so as to be equipped with an anti-entrapment cover meeting the current standards of the American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM) or the American Society of Mechanical Engineers (ASME).

- The Swimming pool, Toddler pool, or Spa is code compliant and has two or more suction outlets a minimum of three feet apart. Field verification is required by inspection.
- The Swimming pool, Toddler pool, or Spa is not compliant and will be modified to be code compliant. This modification will require the completion of the Contractor Certification below.
- The Swimming pool, Toddler pool, or Spa is “Not Readily Accessible” * for inspection and will require inspection and completion of the Contractor Certification.
- Or an approved alternative anti-entrapment device: _____

** Not Readily Accessible means the suction outlet is not plainly visible and compliance is not obvious. Pebble coat and pools where the suction outlet is the same color as the bottom or the water is cloudy or discolored. The city inspectors do not go into the pool for this inspection.*
