### **Immigration: What To Know**

ICE and other federal agencies may come into our city with administrative and judicial warrants and detainers to enforce federal immigration law.

### **Your Rights: What To Do**

You are not required to answer questions, provide comments or offer information without a lawyer.

You have the right to have your case heard by a judge.

You are not required to provide your status or birthplace.

You are not required to sign any documents without legal review.

Never use or show false or fraudulent documents or give a false name.

Administrative immigration warrants do not allow entry into a private dwelling. A warrant issued by a judge can.

You are not required to open your door for an administrative warrant. Ask to slide under the door and carefully review.

Provide written authorization for an emergency contact to make decisions for your children if detained
